

Payment Information

- If you did not nominate your two-year-old as a yearling, you must pay a \$500 late fee by February 15 in addition to the February and April payments for the horse to be eligible to race as a two-year-old.
- If you did nominate your two-year-old as a yearling, but did not make the February 15 payment, then you must pay \$1,100 by April 15. This will allow you to race your horse as a three-year-old only. The horse will not be eligible to race as a two-year-old.
- If you nominated your horse as a yearling, but did not make payments as a two-year-old, your horse can only stake to the three-year-old County Fairs and State Fair races.
- If you did not nominate your NY-bred as a yearling, your horse can only race in the County Fairs. You will have to pay a \$50 late fee by February 15 in addition to the February and April payments.
- If you wish to race your NY-bred only as a three-year-old, you must only nominate it as a yearling and make the \$200 February 15 two-year-old payment.
- All payments are made to the Agriculture & New York State Horse Breeding Development Fund.

Making Payments to the NYSS program



NYSS Yearling Nominations:

- Yearling nomination payments are \$50 and due May 15 each year.
- If you miss the above date, you must pay a \$500 supplemental payment, payable from May to February 15 of the two-year-old year.

Two-Year-Old Payments

Sire Stakes
\$200 due February 15
\$350 due April 15

State Fair
\$100 due February 15
\$200 due April 15

County Fair
\$25 due February 15
\$75 due April 15

Late Closers
\$300 due after the second NYSS race each season.*

Two-Year-Old Payments Total Due

Staking to Sire Stakes:

Three-Year-Old Payments

Sire Stakes
\$250 due February 15
\$450 due April 15

State Fair
\$100 due February 15; \$250 due April 15 (fillies); \$350 due April 15 (colts)

County Fair
\$25 due February 15
\$75 due April 15

Late Closers
\$300 due after the second NYSS race*

Three-Year-Old Payments Total Due

Staking to Sire Stakes:
total payment = \$700

Staking to State Fair:
total payment = \$350 fillies
\$450 colts

Staking to County Fair:
total payment = \$100

Staking only to Late Closers:
total payment =

\$300* plus \$700 initial NYSS payments = \$1000 total payment

NYSS Yearling Information:

- All yearlings must be New York-bred.
- All yearlings must be named and registered.
- A copy of your USTA registration must be included with your nomination fee.

Late Closers Payments:

* The Late Closers due date varies each season. Please visit the NYSS website for the actual due date.

* You must make the February and April NYSS payments and meet the earnings requirements to stake to the Late Closers Series.

About the Fund

The Agriculture and New York State Horse Breeding Development Fund (the Fund) is a public benefit corporation established in 1965 by the Laverne Law (Laws of New

York, Chapter 567 of the Laws of 1965). The mission of the Fund is to promote agriculture through the breeding of standardbred horses and the conduct of equine research within the State. To carry out its legislative mission, the Fund administers the New York Sire Stakes races, State Fair

Series races, Late Closer Events, and County Fair Races. Additionally, the Fund provides assistance to county agriculture societies and contributes to the statewide 4-H program and to the Harry M. Zweig Fund for Equine Research.
